# Annual General Meeting of Tourism Eastern Townships, presentation of the 2023-2026 Strategic Plan and appointment of the new General Manager

**Sherbrooke, June 6, 2023** – The annual general meeting (AGM) of Tourisme Cantons-de-l'Est / Tourism Eastern Townships (TCE) was held at the Jouvence resort in Orford today. It was attended by close to one hundred members, regional partners and TCE employees. During the event, the regional tourism association (ATR) looked back over the past year and unveiled its 2023-2026 Strategic Plan. It also nominated and elected its new board of directors and named its new general manager.

# Review of the past year

Highlights of the past year included relaunching promotions aimed at the tourism markets outside Quebec, winning the *Prix excellence tourisme 2022* award with Tourisme Montérégie, for the development of the Véloroute Gourmande cycling route, the drawing up of a master plan to position the Eastern Townships as a world-class destination for mountain biking and designing sustainable tourism strategies for the region – a first! # 2023-2026 Strategic Plan

The tourism sector is recovering and growing right across the country and the Eastern Townships region is no exception. During the AGM, TCE unveiled its 2023-2026 Strategic Plan. The contents were the result of eight workshops conducted with the team and the Board, a members' survey and input from elected officials and citizens. With the support of Raymond Chabot Grant Thornton (RCGT), the results were coordinated and analyzed, allowing TCE to clarify its role within the tourism industry and embrace the benefits of offering "added value" services.

TCE is committed to responsible and sustainable development and its major goal has been collaborating with other key players in the tourism industry. Integrating knowledge and feedback from other entities has been invaluable for turning ideas into reality and going forward, TCE will continue to follow this collaborative approach. The 2023-2026 Strategic Plan identified four main areas of development for the tourism sector and 15 concrete actions for putting the strategies into practice.

"Our Strategic Plan illustrates the effectiveness of this collaborative approach," says Annie Langevin, General Manager of TCE. "Researching the market and getting input from others not only gives us the tools to make effective business decisions but also reminds us of the important role the tourism sector plays in society and in the growth of the economy."

# 2023-2024 Board of Directors

Caroline Sage, General Manager of Parc de la Gorge de Coaticook (Foresta Lumina) and Parc Découverte Nature, is starting her second year as President of TCE's Board of Directors. She has served on the TCE Board for over 20 years.

The Eastern Townships region is the fourth most popular tourist destination in Quebec. The region attracts some 10 million visitors every year, accounting for 6.5 million overnight stays and spending more than \$900 million annually. The tourism sector is also the region's fourth largest employer, accounting for 17,000 jobs.
